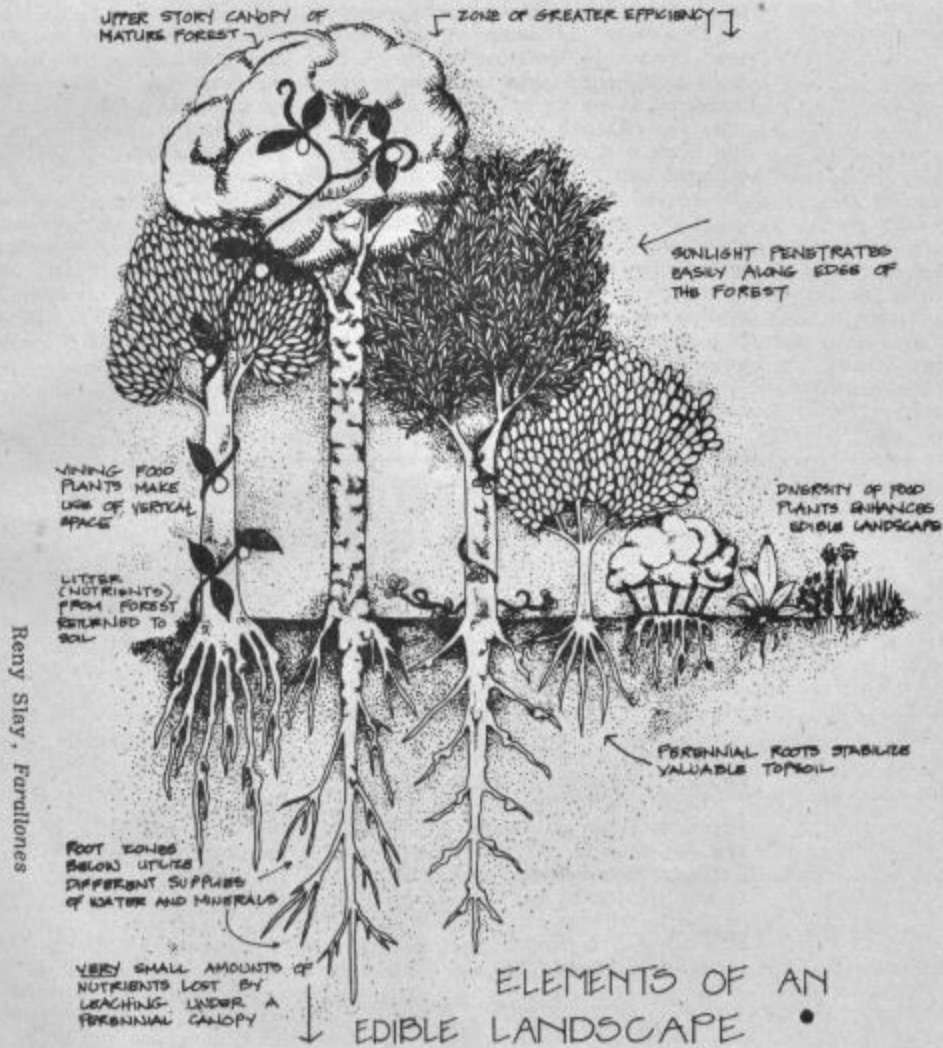

Over 400 people came together to share their knowledge and visions at the two conferences on Permaculture in the Northwest.

The first conference, April 3-5, was held at the Sagle Community Hall, located at the end of a long, quiet country road in Northern Idaho. The second conference, May 8-10, was held at a camp overlooking the Columbia River just east of Corbett, Oregon. In Northern Idaho we met amongst Ponderosa pine, tamarack and aspen. In Oregon we met in the land of Douglas fir, hemlock and red alder. The places and the people may have been different, but everyone was united by a common desire to heal the earth, practice sustainable agriculture, and strengthen our sense of community within the region.

The two short weekends were just the first steps in the learning and sharing process. The conferences were just a beginning, and they didn't end when everyone said their last good-byes and went their

separate ways. Each of us discovered new seeds that will travel with us and sprout throughout the world.

One of the most important seeds planted at the conferences was the seed of friendship, and nurturing that bond is the purpose of this directory.

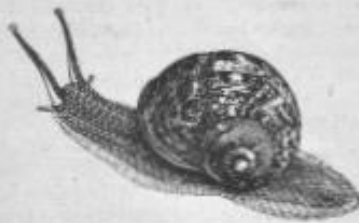
